Important Information for Initial Limited Licensure

A Graduate Assistant Physician license is a **two-year** limited license that allows a medical school graduate to practice temporarily under the direct supervision of a physician who has a full, active, and unencumbered license. **Only** graduates who have **not** received and accepted a residency match may apply for this license.

All applicants must submit proof of:

- Graduation from a school or college of osteopathic medicine approved by an accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education (e.g., a copy of your diploma).
- Successful passage of all parts of the examination conducted by National Board of Osteopathic Medical Examiners or other examination approved by the board.
- A written protocol drafted by a physician with a full, active, and unencumbered license that complies with the requirements of Rules 64B8-7.005 and 64B15-12.005, F.A.C.

AND

Must **not** have received and accepted a residency match from the National Resident Match Program within the first year following graduation from medical school.

Important Information for Renewal

Graduate Assistant Physician limited licensees may apply for a **one-time** renewal that expires after **one year**. A Graduate Assistant Physician who has received a limited license is **not eligible** to apply for another limited license, regardless of whether they received a one-time renewal.

Applicants for renewal must submit the following:

- Documentation of actual practice under the required protocol during the initial limited licensure period (e.g., a letter of verification from employer).
- Documentation of applications submitted for accredited graduate medical education training programs (e.g., confirmation of application receipt from training program).

Licensees will be notified when their retention date is approaching and will be provided instructions on how to retain their fingerprints to avoid having to submit a new background screening.

Licensure shall automatically expire after two years without further action by the board or the department unless an application for renewal is approved by the Board of Osteopathic Medicine. It is the **licensee's responsibility** to apply for renewal. No notice of renewal will be sent out. If the renewal application is not submitted, the license will become null and void at the time of expiration.

- Documentation of **actual practice under the required protocol** during the initial limited licensure period (e.g., a letter of verification from employer).

The one-time renewal expires after one year. A Graduate Assistant Physician who has received a limited license is not eligible to apply for another limited license, regardless of whether they received a one-time renewal.

This notice is to inform you that when you submit a set of fingerprints to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) for the purpose of conducting a search for any Florida and national criminal history records that may pertain to you, the results of that search will be returned to the Care Provider Background Screening Clearinghouse. By submitting fingerprints, you are authorizing the dissemination of any state and national criminal history record to be employed, licensed, work under contract, or serve as a volunteer, pursuant to the National Child Protection Act of 1993, as amended, and section 943.0542, Florida Statutes. "Specified agency" means the Department of Health, the Department of Children and Family Services, the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation within the Department of Education, the Agency for Health Care Administration, the Department of Elder Affairs, the Department of Juvenile Justice, and the Agency for Person with Disabilities when these agencies are conducting state and national criminal history background screening on persons who provide care for children or persons who are elderly or disabled. The fingerprints submitted will be retained by FDLE and the Clearinghouse will be notified if FDLE receives Florida arrest information on you.

Your Social Security Number (SSN) is needed to keep records accurate because other people may have the same name and birth date. - If you do not provide the correct Originating Agency Identification (ORI) number to the Livescan service provider, the board office will not receive your background screening results.
- The ORI number for the Board of Medicine is **EDOH2015Z**.
- You must provide accurate demographic information to the Livescan service provider at the time your fingerprints are taken, **including your Social Security number (SSN)**.
- Typically, background screening results submitted through a Livescan service provider are received by the board within 24-72 hours of being processed.
- If you obtain your Livescan from a service provider who does not capture your photo you may be required to be reprinted by another agency in the future.
